"My obsession with stripes is undeniable, partially in rooms with exceptionally tall ceilings as they further elongate the height—a design approach we implemented in our Kips Bay showroom last year." Furthermore, curtains are exactly where form meets function. Setting

them up provides you with privacy, protects you from unwanted light especially when you're sleeping, blocks out exterior noise, and more. "I'm enjoying wool window treatments, as they hang beautifully and add warmth," designer Zoe Feldman points out. "We've also gone with café curtains in a few of our recent kitchens, which give a quaint, slightly British feel that I love." Another crucial factor to think about is whether you want something

custom made or not. "Window treatments cost more than people assume, for market-ready curtains of good quality, budget at least \$300 for an average residential window, and for a specialty textile, expect to pay more than \$1,000 per window," says designer Garrett Hunter. If you're interested in custom options, you have to significantly increase your budget. "Depending on the fabric and style you're after, one pair could cost around \$5,000 for full-length curtains installed on a solid brass French return rod with rings," designer Sarah Roberts Hale of the firm
